THE PURPOSE OF THIS POLICY IS TO ENSURE THAT WE:



- Promote awareness about sustainability in procurement amongst, colleagues, suppliers, and subcontractors.
- Procure products and services based on sustainable performance and functional requirements.
- Develop measures of sustainable procurement practice and include further sustainability criteria when evaluating potential suppliers.
- Analyse the performance of suppliers to identify areas for improvement against those measures and criteria.
- Use the results of our monitoring to benchmark our performance against similar organisations.
- Continuously comply with all relevant legislation and regulatory requirements.
- Ensure we work collaboratively with our suppliers, so they understand our sustainability targets and our expectations from them when it comes to sustainability.
